This CORO6 antibody is generated from rabbits immunized with a KLH conjugated synthetic peptide between 337-365 amino acids from the C-terminal region of human CORO6.

Purified polyclonal antibody supplied in PBS with 0.09% (W/V) sodium azide. This antibody is purified through a protein A column, followed by peptide affinity purification.

Storage

CORO6 Antibody (C-term) is for research use only and not for use in diagnostic or therapeutic procedures.

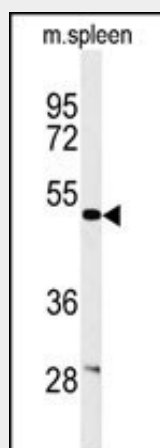

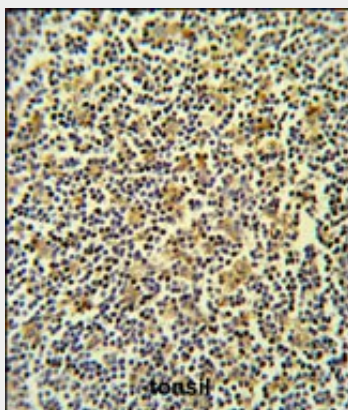
