PYCRL Blocking Peptide (Center) - Protein Information**Name** PYCR3 ([HGNC:25846](#))**Function**

Oxidoreductase that catalyzes the last step in proline biosynthesis, which corresponds to the reduction of pyrroline-5- carboxylate (P5C) to L-proline using NAD(P)H (PubMed:23024808, PubMed:36414121). Proline is synthesized from either glutamate or ornithine; both are converted to P5C, and then to proline via pyrroline-5-carboxylate reductases (PYCRs) (PubMed:23024808). PYCR3 is exclusively linked to the biosynthesis of proline from ornithine (PubMed:23024808).

Cellular Location

Cytoplasm.
