Target/Specificity

The synthetic peptide sequence used to generate the antibody [AP7366c](/products/AP7366c) was selected from the Center region of human SERPINH1. A 10 to 100 fold molar excess to antibody is recommended. Precise conditions should be optimized for a particular assay.

Format

Peptides are lyophilized in a solid powder format. Peptides can be reconstituted in solution using the appropriate buffer as needed.

Storage

Maintain refrigerated at 2-8°C for up to 6 months. For long term storage store at -20°C.

Binds specifically to collagen. Could be involved as a chaperone in the biosynthetic pathway of collagen.

SERPINH1 Antibody (Center) Blocking Peptide - Background

SERPINH1 is a member of the serpin superfamily of serine proteinase inhibitors. Its expression is induced by heat shock. The protein localizes to the endoplasmic reticulum lumen and binds collagen; thus it is thought to be a molecular chaperone involved in the maturation of collagen molecules. Autoantibodies to this protein have been found in patients with rheumatoid arthritis.
